Course Objectives

Program Goal: To improve the knowledge and evidence-based practice of clinicians practicing in nutrition support, specifically in the areas of parenteral nutrition, vitamin D, and critical care nutrition. By completion of this knowledge based program, participants should be able to:

1. Describe how the composition of a lipid emulsion impacts hepatic function and explain how fish oil derived fat emulsions affect the critically ill patient.
2. Describe the role of sunlight for vitamin D, production of vitamin D, and its impact on clinical conditions.
3. Identify patients receiving long-term parenteral nutrition (PN) who are at risk for developing altered trace element states and describe how to manage their PN including guidelines for use of parental iron.
4. Describe the SCCM/ASPEN Guidelines for nutrition support in the adult critically ill patient, the Nutrition Bundle and its implementation.
5. Discuss ways to implement nutrition protocols and algorithms in the critical care setting, identify the team members involved, and identify barriers to overcome.
